Main Point

So far in our series we have looked at our riches in Christ and the abundance of our Father's wealth; the "hallowing" of God's name as the "end" of all prayer; the joy of interceding on behalf of others; and Hannah's prayer of desperation. This morning, we turn to Luke's Gospel and the Parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector where we see a stark contrast in the heart posture of two individuals and their approach to God. As we will see, the tax collector demonstrates a sincere heart of humility and an appropriate self-assessment common throughout the scripture's many sacred conversations.
